

"Without the Mission, I'd Be on the Streets"

Dawn Marie's dad died when she was just two, but she says she had a pleasant childhood and a good relationship with her mom. But something soured in that relationship when Dawn was in her mid-20s and started having children of her own ... and that would have dire consequences many years down the road.

In the meantime, Dawn Marie pressed on, working a steady job and raising two girls. In 2010, she suffered a back injury and had to stop working. She was denied disability benefits at first, making life more difficult. She relied on food stamps to feed her family.

Life got even harder. Dawn Marie's mom almost died in 2015 — and would have died had Dawn Marie not rushed her to the emergency room. Still, there was no reconciliation between them. Two months later, her stepfather died, bringing more grief and pain.

Dawn Marie hit rock bottom two years ago when she was evicted from her apartment over a misunderstanding with her landlord. She asked her mother if she could move in temporarily, but the answer was no. Dawn Marie wasn't surprised at the answer, *"but coming from my mom, that hurt,"* she says.

Facing the possibility of life on the streets, Dawn Marie started "freaking out," as she remembers it. Though her daughters were young adults by now, she feared the worst. Fortunately, it never came to that. Someone referred her to Buffalo City Mission, and she walked through our doors with a sense of gratitude . . . and hope.

Discovering God's Love

Thanks to your compassion, Dawn Marie, now 50, found the help she needed at the Mission. Upon arrival, she received the urgent, practical assistance of shelter and meals. And then came other kinds of help — the emotional and spiritual kind. She

was embraced with grace and showered with encouragement. And she came to know God's love.

"I was never really into the Bible before," Dawn Marie says. "But I absolutely love the religion classes. I'm becoming more spiritual, and reading my Bible more."

She's currently in transitional housing, and the Mission is helping in her search for affordable independent housing. Dawn Marie wants you to know she's grateful. *"Thank you for your support!"* she says. *"Without the Mission, I'd be on the streets."*
