Growing up in an abusive home, Yvonne got out as soon as she was old enough to date. But as it often happens, she ended up in one toxic relationship after another.

"Being abused was all I knew," she says. "It was my comfort zone. I just didn't care enough about myself. It was rough."

She had six children by multiple partners, but none of the relationships lasted. So Yvonne, essentially a single mom, was just trying to hang on and make life work.

But it wasn't working. *"I was a very angry person,"* she says. She attempted suicide several times.

Unbelievably, her life would take an even darker turn. Her 11-year-old daughter was killed in a car accident in 2004. It devastated Yvonne, who turned to drugs to cope.

About a year later, alone in a hotel room, high on cocaine, and penniless, Yvonne felt a nudge. She called a friend and said, *"I need help. I've got to get out of this life."*

Yvonne turned things around and started following Jesus. She raised her kids and was doing well for years. Until last fall ...

Not Rock Bottom

In November 2024, Yvonne had a full hysterectomy to remove a cancerous tumor. Complicated family dynamics left her with no place to go and recover, and she ended up at Buffalo City Mission.

She says it's the best thing that ever happened.

"People think going to a homeless shelter is hitting rock bottom," she says. "I don't consider it that way. I consider being here bouncing back. Nothing but good things have happened since I've been here."

At the top of that list: Complete healing from the hysterectomy and a cancer-free diagnosis.

Yvonne says the Mission's compassionate staff has helped her to work through past trauma, and she's grown stronger in her faith. She's in our transitional housing program and attending online seminary classes. She wants to minister to others.

"I don't feel homeless," Yvonne says. "I feel like I'm exactly where I'm meant to be."

"Before the Mission, I was a lonely, pain-filled person who wasn't living, just existing. God took that and turned it into something beautiful. Now I can look in the mirror with love and respect."

Thanks to you, neighbors like Yvonne can discover their God-given worth!

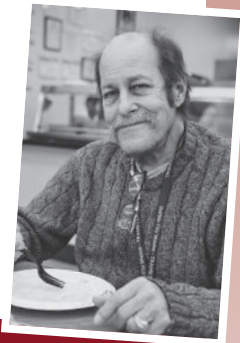
